Solution Not Pollution – Mobility of Young People

Solution Not Pollution aims to support young people to develop their critical and creative thinking skills, and to develop solutions to some of the climate change challenges that we are facing.

To support young people from Germany, France, Czech Republic, and Ireland to form lasting partnerships to address climate change in their communities, all project partners sent two young people to Dresden from 11th to 15th April to test the Solution Not Pollution WebQuest activities and to generate their own solutions to the climate crisis.

During this week in Dresden, young people from Ireland, France, Germany, and Czech Republic participated in team activities, and generated their own ideas for how young people in their communities could support climate action!

Solution Not Pollution Final Conference in Ireland!

The Solution Not Pollution Final Conference was held in Belturbet Town Hall, in Belturbet, Cavan on Tuesday, 10th May 2022.

The Conference was opened by local politician, Brendan Smith TD, and keynote addresses were also delivered by Mr. Ross Boyd, the Vice President for the Union of Students Ireland, and Welfare and Sustainability Officer in Dublin City University; and by Mr. Darragh McAvinney, a spokesperson for the Zero Waste Belturbet project, which aimed to support young people in Belturbet to get a better understanding of what can be done in their community to reduce waste and tackle climate change.
