#### **INTRODUCTION**

We all like to be trendy, but did you know that as green fashion and upcycling is gaining more and more space, the creation of new clothing from old textiles is the new trend in many European countries, including Germany?

And there is a good reason for that! Research by Eurostat has found that a standard German produces 633kg of waste a year: that's almost 200kg higher than the EU-wide average. Meanwhile, another survey found that Germans have 5.2 billion pieces of clothing stashed away in their wardrobes - 40 percent of which is never worn and simply thrown away!

In this WebQuest, you will understand the clear difference between recycling and upcycling, what slow fashion is, why wasting should not ever be an option, and why exploring innovative upcycling solutions plays a paramount role in environmental protection.

#### **TASK**

Nowadays, repeating outfits is the new chic, considering that fashion is cyclical and if you hang on to old clothes, they eventually become 'retro'. That is a mindset you support as a highly influential eco-friendly blogger, who decides to start with your team-mates a new section in your blog, that will provide podcasts to inform your followers about "hot" issues concerning the environment. As a team you make a poll asking your subscribers what topic your first podcast should cover. The vast majority of them want you to highlight the best practices of clothes' upcycling.

Considering their choice, you decide along with your team of 4, to use your smartphones to record a podcast. You will install free mobile software in your devices in order to record,







edit and present to your fans a tailor-made podcast with the title "Upcycle your Style". In this podcast you will give few examples and smart advices underlining the essence of upcycling and the importance of looking to your wardrobe from a different angle.

This topic of upcycling really motivates your team to inspire your fans to act in an environmentally friendly way! So, make sure you give them nothing but the best! Let's start working!

#### **PROCESS**

#### Step 1: What do we know about upcycling?

Recycling has changed from throwing something away, to turning it into something we can use again, either in its current form or as something else. Upcycling on the other hand is taking something we might recycle and transforming it into something more valuable. In times when we create too much waste, upcycling is becoming a fun way to reduce the amount of garbage we generate and reduce our environmental footprint.

Moreover, upcycling is more energy efficient because materials are not broken down or degraded. Instead, they are reimagined and repurposed, by adding value and quality while extending their life.

Upcycling, Recycling, Downcycling, Slow Fashion — there are so many terms that we sometimes really get lost. Figure out how all these terms are defined so as to be able to inform your fans that are going to listen to your podcast about them, by visiting the following websites. Take into consideration that being sustainable is not about stopping how many clothes you buy but learning how to buy products of high quality, ethical and Fairtrade. By buying clothes made with pre-existing materials we can contribute to minimising our environmental footprint as we can save an enormous amount of water, slow down unnecessary virgin textile production and drastically reduce landfill mass with its associated emissions burden.

Now that you have learned the basics regarding clothes' upcycling, you can proceed to step 2 of the process!

#### Step 2: Let's talk about ethics and fairness!

Smart and environmentally friendly shopping and consumption of clothing has three phases. The first phase begins when one cloth item is purchased. The second phase starts when it is sold online or donated to a charity. Keep in mind that one man's trash is another man's treasure! And what happens when a clothing item is in a condition that it can no longer be re-purchased? This is when the third phase starts. The upcycling phase.

You've been introduced to the upcycling process and you start wondering, as a team, to what extent upcycling is fair, environmentally friendly and ethically correct. Start a conversation with your team-mates and write down important questions regarding these two important topics that your audience could have and would like to be answered. Some examples of these questions are:

- 1. How does the global fashion industry work?
- 2. What conditions exist in the workplace in clothes' production plants?
- 3. What is happening to the clothes' production value chain that could harm the earth's ecosystems?
- 4. How does upcycling impact the environment, clothes' production, commercialisation and promotion?





Add any other question that you think is essential and try to respond to them by conducting some research:

Having your notes in your hands, your answers to the questions you discussed as a team and all the appropriate information for supporting the idea of incorporating upcycled fashion in our daily shopping habits for combating climate change and other environmental challenges, proceed to the next step and start creating your podcast!

#### Step 4: How to make a great podcast!

Podcasts seem to be a growing trend that is here to stay. These days the average person has at least heard of podcasting and understands the concept. And almost 40% of people listen to podcasts every month! But there is still a lot of confusion and misconceptions about the meaning of podcasting.

In a little more detail, a podcast is a series of spoken words, audio episodes, all focused on a particular topic or theme. You can subscribe to the show with an app on your phone and listen to episodes whenever you like on your headphones, in the car or through speakers.

#### Step 5: Start podcasting!

Based on the plan you have developed and the roles assigned, start developing your podcast called "Upcycle your Style"!

The first step in this creative process is to reach leaders in the industry of upcycled fashion and bring them on your show. Contact them via email, via texting apps, via social media and ask them to enrich your audio content with their insights and their fresh and innovative ideas on the upcycling topic. During this process don't be shy and communicate the purpose of your project clearly and with passion!

The challenge is big! Hosting a podcast interview is a lot harder than it sounds. It's not a simple as having a friendly chat in front of a pair of microphones. If you don't prepare, you





could end up with a boring interview that fails to entertain your listeners and has bad reviews.

Follow these 11 ways to be exceptionally prepared for your podcast Interview:

Prepare your script where you have to include what you have learned while implementing step 1 to 3 of this process. Include all the important information you gathered through your research on the upcycling topic and decide when the most appropriate moment is to introduce your audience to the upcycled fashion leader you managed to interview. The best podcast episodes may sound like casual, free-flowing conversations, but that's due to the hours of preparation and planning the hosts do before hitting the record button.
